What is the Core Clinical Systems Renewal Program?

An integrated, whole-of-life, client-centric electronic health record that supports the provision of public health (acute, primary and community) services to patients and clients across the Northern Territory.



Why are we doing it?

- **Improve population health through the provision of essential clinical information at the point of care.**
- **Current systems will not be supported beyond 2021 and this represents a significant risk to managing the health system**

Program Overview

NT Health currently uses four core clinical systems:

- 15 – 25 years old and technically obsolete
- Inadequate to safely meet future requirements

In May 2017 – CCSRP was funded by NT Government for \$259 mill over five years

- Create a single, secure, digitally enabled, Territory-wide electronic health record
- InterSystems was the successful vendor following a rigorous procurement process
- The Program is to be fully implemented and in use across NT Health by mid 2021

The system will be the most comprehensive clinical system deployed in Australia

NT Health Context

- 6 Hospitals + 25 Urban Services
- 54 Remote Clinics
